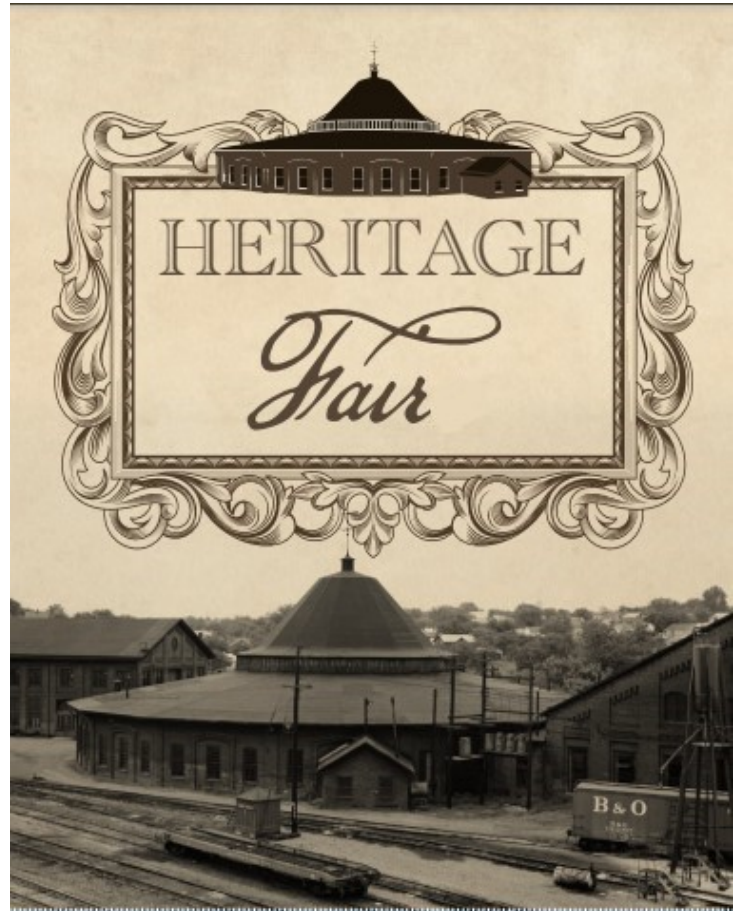


Heritage Fair & Train Raid Activity Guide
