Mission Statement

PURPOSE

Martinsburg Farmers Market at the Roundhouse is located at the historic Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Martinsburg Shops, West Virginia's 16th National Historic Landmark in the heart of Downtown Martinsburg, WV.

The mission of the market is to promote locally grown and produced food, honey and maple syrup within a 40-mile radius of Martinsburg in support of efforts to revitalize a historic area and build a healthy community where we work and live.

Martinsburg Farmers Market at the Roundhouse supports the local economy, school children, increases marketing opportunities for farmers and small businesses, provides access to an assortment of local and regional-sourced products, and increases access to healthy, affordable fresh food in the Martinsburg area.

The Martinsburg Roundhouse hosts the farmers market and provides shelter from rain and wind, offers indoor seating for customers, and games for children.

The market serves as a place for community members to gather, share a meal, and learn something new from a farmer, grower, producer, demonstrations, workshops and exhibitors.

SPONSORING AGENCY: The Berkeley County Roundhouse Authority with support from The West Virginia Department of Agriculture, WVU Health, and the United Way of the Eastern Panhandle.

The market is held April through October across from the Caperton (Martinsburg, WV) Train Station. Patrons may park at the train station and walk across the railroad tracks in an enclosed walkway for a scenic view and take an elevator down to the Roundhouse where the Farmers Market is located. ADA parking is available on-site by typing 105 East Liberty Street in your GPS.

The market is well attended by residents, Roundhouse guests, and tourists.

Martinsburg Farmers Market at the Roundhouse offers wellness checks, vaccination clinics, music, and more. There are scheduled and pop-up events and demonstrations to educate eaters of all ages about their food, and where it comes from.

Our unique location and proximity to the D.C. Metro area, in a historic B&O Railroad facility, along with the tourist appeal of Martinsburg's historic districts, parks, orchards, arts, and more, afford the opportunity to attract patrons and foodies from around the region.
